

Which has led us to being uber creative with our learning. We have explored clay to make our very own Bell Beaker Pots, inspired by the Beaker Folk of the Bronze Age, we have made Bronze axes and necklaces inspired by our learning and even acted out being part of the Bronze Age civilization – wow Holly class – I am sure you are all exhausted!

In English, we have started a new reading journey with 'The Pebble in my Pocket', albeit a very scientific and factual book about the history of our Earth, the language and writing of Meredith Hooper has us hooked! • We have contacted the Highways agency to request the urgent remarking of the yellow lines outside our school so that the area is prominent


- Whilst we are waiting for this to be completed cones will be placed in this area to respectfully request that all drivers ensure the safety of our pupils by not parking in this area
